If your Hub has lots of new people you may want to start with this icebreaker. Start by going around the group asking these quick fire questions, asking everyone the first question and then going around again for the second and so on. You might want to take a mental note of a few of the questions, especially 3, 5 and 7.

1. What is your name?
2. What is your favourite breakfast?
3. In a group, are you normally the last or first to speak?
4. What are you geeky about?
5. When you're processing new ideas, do you like to process out loud or do you need time to think first?
6. Do you have a secret skill people might not know about yet?
7. What are you hoping to get from being part of this Hub?

- What do you want to get out of being part of this Hub?

WHAT DOES LOVE LOOK LIKE?

- What makes you feel loved, especially in Hub but in any community?
- What would a really loving community look like to you?
- How can we encourage each other to grow in love?

WHAT DOES OUR HUB LOOK LIKE THIS TERM?

- What would you like to see from our Hub this term? How can we grow?
- What could we do together as we head into summer?
- This may also be a good time to start discussions of multiplication.
